INTRODUCTION

Dee Cover, Assistant Curator of Collections at the DeKalb Public Library donated the Clark C. Cryor audiovisual collection to the Regional History Center on September 9, 2006. Additional films were added at later dates.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Clark C. Cryor Audiovisual Collection contains 16mm film-reels arranged chronologically, from the 1950s through the 1970s. Several of the 16mm films were transferred to DVD and/or VHS tape by the DeKalb Public Library and donated to the Center. The DeKalb Public Library also has copies of the DVD and VHS tape reproductions. Included in the collection are histories of the DeKalb Daily Chronicle Newspaper, the Jacob Haish Memorial Library, and the Automatic Electric Company of Genoa, Illinois. Other films include landscapes around the city of DeKalb and recreational activities of Mr. Cryor. Researchers interested in other film reels held by the Regional History Center should consult the Regional Collections Guide to Sources.

HISTORICAL SKETCH

Clark C. Cryor was born in Dixon in 1907. He was an insurance broker for the Crum-Halsted Insurance Agency. He was active in the community, serving as president of the DeKalb Rotary Club, Chairman of the United Fund Drive during the 1950s, as well as being a lifelong member of the Elk's Club No. 765. An avid photographer, Clark founded Cry-Dun Studios of DeKalb. He produced industrial, public service, and educational film strips and movies, some of which won him international awards. Clark passed away on February 21, 1977.
